### **Our Staff**

The nursery team consists of a qualified teacher (Mrs Fallows) and three educational teaching support assistants (Mrs Takila, Mrs Ahmed and Mrs Ahmed. Mrs Padley will be covering Mrs Fallows Planning and Preparation Time.

### **Our Curriculum**

In September 2012 the Government introduced the revised curriculum called the Early Years Foundation Stage, for all children from birth to five years and the areas in **bold** are the key (Prime) areas for nursery.

The curriculum organises children's learning into seven areas of learning.

- **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**
- **Communication and Language**
- **Physical Development**
- Literacy
- Maths
- Understanding the World
- Expressive Art and Design

Activities are planned so that children develop their knowledge and practice their skills across a number of areas of learning. The curriculum is delivered through well-planned play, using exciting, enjoyable equipment and activities that challenge children. There is always a lot on offer for the children to either access independently, through adult-planned and led activities as well as focused group times.

### **Topic**

Our topic this term is colour through celebrations. We will be settling into nursery and learning how to use our super listening ears and incredible looking eyes.

We will also be learning lots of new routine songs to help us remember what to do in nursery.
